Local Attractions in the DMV

- Capital One Arena Is an indoor arena in Washington, D.C. Located in Chinatown (sports, music & other entertainment).
- **George Washington's Mount Vernon** Is the former residence and plantation of George Washington located in Alexandria, VA.
- Fedex Field Is an American football stadium located in Landover, Maryland.
- National Harbor The site has a convention center, six hotels, restaurants, shops, and condominiums.
 National Harbor hosted Cirque du Soleil and also features outdoor activities such as a culinary festival and outdoor concerts by military bands, an outdoor movie screen facing the river, kayaking, an annual ice sculpture exhibition, and a Peeps Day with a Peeps eating contest. The national spelling bee competition is held there.
- **Gravelly Point Park** Gravelly Point has served as an iconic spot for plane spotters, picnickers and others to watch planes take off and land from National Airport for more than half a century.
- The Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center (also called the Udvar-Hazy Center) Is the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum (NASM)'s annex at Dulles International Airport in the Chantilly area of Fairfax County, Virginia. It holds numerous exhibits, including the Space Shuttle *Discovery*, the *Enola Gay*, and the Boeing 367-80, the main prototype for the popular Boeing 707 airliner.
- John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts Commonly referred to as the Kennedy Center) is the United States National Cultural Center, located on the eastern bank of the Potomac River in Washington, D.C.
- Mount Vernon Trail is an 18-mile (29 km) long shared use path that travels along the George
 Washington Memorial Parkway in Northern Virginia between Rosslyn and George Washington's home
 at Mount Vernon. The trail connects the easternmost portions of Arlington County, the City of
 Alexandria, and Fairfax County, and travels mostly on dedicated trail with a small portion on city
 streets.

- Fort Hunt Park is a public park located in Fort Hunt, Fairfax County, Virginia. It is administered by the National Park Service as part of the George Washington Memorial Parkway. The park preserves the remains of the eponymous Fort Hunt, portions of which date to the time of the Spanish–American War.
- Lake Accotink Is a reservoir in North Springfield in Fairfax County, Virginia. The park has bikes, canoes, paddleboats, and rowboats available for rent. Visitors can also ride tour boats or walk or run the 3.75 miles (6.04 km) trail loop around the lake. Other trails stretch beyond the park and connect to the Cross County Trail, with its running trails and mountain biking trail. A miniature golf course surrounds an antique carousel near the south entrance to the park. Gas-powered motorboats are not allowed on the lake.
- Great Falls Park- Overlooks the Great Falls of the Potomac River. The park has several viewing platforms that provide visitors with vantage points overlooking the falls. Fifteen miles (24 km) of hiking trails traverse the park and follow a small stream known as Difficult Run. A scenic trail near the river travels upstream from a landing at the mouth of Difficult Run, climbs to the top of Mather Gorge and passes the falls, a dam, and a reservoir before ending in Fairfax County's Riverbend Park. Rock climbers frequent the cliffs in Mather Gorge above the Potomac. The park contains a large picnic area and sufficient parking for 600 vehicles. On busy weekends, all the parking may fill up by early in the morning, creating delays and temporary closures lasting up to several hours. The NPS does not permit camping in the park. The falls total 76 feet (20 m) over a series of major cascades. The Great Falls are rated Class 5-6 Whitewater. Below the falls, through Mather Gorge, the river is rated class 2-3 and has been a very popular kayaking run since the 1960s.
- Huntley Meadows Park The largest park operated by the Fairfax County Park Authority, is located in the Hybla Valley area of Fairfax County, Virginia, south of the city of Alexandria. The park features a visitor center, a beaver-created wetland with boardwalk, wildlife observation platforms, and an interpretative trail system. The park is home to abundant wildlife and is known for attracting many birds, amphibians, and plants that are considered less common in the region.
- Dyke Marsh Wildlife Preserve is a freshwater wetland and wildlife preserve located on the west bank of the Potomac River south of Alexandria, Virginia between Old Town Alexandria and Mount Vernon. Dyke Marsh consists of about 380 acres (1.5 km²) of tidal marsh, floodplain, and swamp forest. It formed 5,000 to 7,000 years ago. With a total size of 485 acres, Dyke Marsh is one of the largest remaining pieces of freshwater tidal wetlands left in the Baltimore-Washington Metropolitan Area. The marsh is managed by the National Park Service as part of the George Washington Memorial Parkway. Dyke Marsh contains a wide array of plant and animal life. "Haul Road" is a trail that leads visitors into the marsh. It is frequented by area birdwatchers. Dyke Marsh is located off the George Washington Memorial Parkway at the Belle Haven Marina exit.
